Residents of a block of flats in Punggol have recently seen troops of long-tailed macaques eating at their void deck. Some of these monkeys even climb trees and enter the flats to steal food! It is risky for them as they could fall and hurt themselves. These problems are happening more often because new buildings are replacing forests. 5
Monkeys and other wild animals, like otters and wild boars, are now entering cities looking for food.

Many problems happen because people feed the animals out of pity or leave leftover food unattended. This makes the animals rely on humans as an easy source of food. Some residents have suggested 10
relocating the macaques, but experts say this is not a solution as another troop of monkeys can come and take their place.

Macaques have also linked plastic bags with the presence of food and will try to snatch them. As some of these macaques have exhibited aggressive behaviour, the authorities have advised the 15
residents to be alert and avoid eye contact with them.

We should stop feeding wildlife and learn how to live with them. Teaching children to respect animals and nature can help. After all, some wild animals, like owls, are helpful and do not pose a problem at 20
all.
